TRANSFER APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All prospective students interested in enrolling should apply online through UGA's Office of Undergraduate Admissions website. Please review the [Transfer Eligibility Requirements](#) for a complete list of the requirements that must be met in order to be considered for admission to the undergraduate programs at UGA's Griffin campus.

Eligibility for transfer admission consideration to the UGA Griffin General Business program requires:

- Graduation from high school at least 12 months prior to the term of intended enrollment at UGA Griffin
- Completion of at least one year of college by the term of intended enrollment at UGA Griffin
- Completion of at least 60 semester hours of transferable credit by the application deadline
- Transfer GPA of at least 2.80 (3.0 for Spring 2025 applicants and beyond) as calculated by UGA Admissions Office
- Completion of General Education Areas I-VI of the BBA Core Curriculum *

Major Required Courses (21 hours)

A minimum of 21 semester credit hours of coursework is required. Choose seven (3 hour) business courses 3000-level or above from the following, with no more than three courses from any one business prefix: ACCT, BUSN, ECON, ENTR, FINA, ILAD, INTB, LEGL, MARK, MBUS, MGMT, MIST, MSIT, REAL, RMIN. General Business majors may also choose up to two 3-hour courses (6 hours) of 3000 level or higher FHCE coursework to satisfy Major Required area. *NOTE: In the Major Required Area and General Electives Area combined, choose no more than five courses, 4000-level or above, from any one business prefix.* All major courses must be satisfied with a grade of "C" (2.0) or better.

GENERAL ELECTIVES

Upper Division General Electives (12 hours)

Complete 12 hours of courses numbered 3000-5999. At least 3 hours must be in residence from a Terry College course prefix: [ACCT](#), [BUSN](#), [ECON](#), [ENTR](#), [FINA](#), [ILAD](#), [INTB](#), [LEGL](#), [MARK](#), [MBUS](#), [MGMT](#), [MIST](#), [REAL](#), & [RMIN](#)

The additional 9 hours can be from any prefix. Students may also transfer any 3000-level or above business prefix course(s).

General Electives – University Wide (Non-Business) (12 hours)

Complete a minimum of 12 hours of 1000-level and above courses, excluding courses with the following prefixes: ACCT, BUSN, ECON, ENTR, FINA, ILAD, INTB, LEGL, MARK, MBUS, MGMT, MIST, REAL, or RMIN.
